However, while there is a growing body of literature on the link between financial inclusion and different aspects of women's economic empowerment, there is still little empirical evidence to understand the link between financial inclusion and the incidence of IPV.

Advancing Financial Inclusion Metrics: Shifting from access to economic empowerment. Financial inclusion is at a turning point. Due to advances in technology, the unprecedented advent of transactional and behavioral big data and greater multistakeholder collaboration, there is a realistic opportunity to reach the financially excluded – estimated to be 2 billion – and the many more that are underserved.
