The Joint Commission recently issued numerous changes to its Hospital Accreditation Standards (HAS) Environment of Care (EC) and Life Safety (LS) chapters. TJC accredited hospitals should closely review all changes within the HAS book itself. TJC's Prepublication Requirements issued June 20, 2014 identified the below-listed EC chapter changes that took effect July 2, 2014.

Complying with the TJC Hospital Record of Care Chapter

In 2014, the issue of incomplete neurological screenings cropped up again. The frequent finding was that the neurological screening did not address all of the cranial nerves II – XII (a CMS requirement.) For BH organizations, the issues were similar but in 2014 the topic of trauma assessment was cited more frequently than in the past.

Provision of Care Chapter: Highlights from 2014 TJC ...

A population is generally defined as a collection of patients sharing a common set of universally measured characteristics, such as an ICD-10-CM Principal Diagnosis Code or ICD-10-PCS Procedure Code or CPT® Code (For Outpatients only).
