Reflective teaching means looking at what you do in the classroom, thinking about why you do it, and thinking about if it works - a process of self-observation and self-evaluation. By collecting information about what goes on in our classroom, and by analysing and evaluating this information, we identify and explore our own practices and underlying beliefs.

When students become reflective about the teaching and learning process, they are strengthening their own capacity to learn. Central to this is the principal of reflection as metacognition, where students are aware of and can describe their thinking in a way that allows them to "close the gap" between what they know and what they need to learn. "Reflective learners assimilate new learning, relate it to what they already know, adapt it for their own purposes, and translate thought into action.

In summary, reflective practice incorporates reflection in, on and for action as well as reflection within. Seeking information from various lenses serves to further strengthen reflective practice. Reflection is a process of exploring and examining ourselves, our perspectives, attributes, experiences, actions and interactions. It helps us gain insight and see how to move forward. Reflection attempts to move beyond simply describing events.
