The single most striking feature of the 1848 revolutions was their simultaneity. This was the only truly European revolution that there has ever been. Neither the great French revolution of 1789, nor the 1830 revolutions that began in Paris, nor the Paris Commune of 1870, nor the Russian Revolutions of 1917 achieved this effortless cascading from one state to the next.
