All surgical wounds do require support and this is an important factor both for reducing oedema and ensuring patient comfort. This type of dressing is generally left intact for five to seven days and then removed for inspection of the suture line, with the view to remove the staples or sutures as prescribed.

Post-operative Surgical Wound Management: Wound Healing ...

Most clean surgical wounds and recent traumatic injuries are managed by primary closure. Delayed primary intention - when the wound is infected or requires more thorough intensive cleaning or debridement prior to primary closure usually 3-7 days later. May be used for traumatic wounds or contaminated surgical wounds.

Dressings for surgical wounds The primary function of a wound dressing is to promote healing by providing a moist environment and protecting the wound from potentially harmful agents or injury (Turner, 1985). In closed surgical wounds the main function of the dressing is to absorb blood or haemoserous fluid in the immediate postoperative phase.

Guideline Surgical site infections: prevention and treatment

Next. This guideline covers preventing and treating surgical site infections in adults, young people and children who are having a surgical procedure involving a cut through the skin. It focuses on methods used before, during and after surgery to minimise the risk of infection. In August 2020, we added links to the NICE guideline on perioperative care in adults for additional recommendations on intravenous fluids, cardiac monitoring and blood glucose control in adults.

Postoperative care bundles recommend that surgical dressings be kept undisturbed for a minimum of 48 hours after surgery unless leakage occurs.

Coding Guidelines for Wound Care Debridement of a wound, performed before the application of topical or local anesthesia is billed with CPT codes 11042 – 11047. Wound debridements (11042-11047) are reported by the depth of tissue that is removed and by the surface area of the wound.

SSIs are responsible for increased readmission rates, length of stay, reoperation, morbidity, and mortality, as well as increased overall health care costs.^{1,2}

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
